

CURTAINS HANGING GUIDE PENCIL PLEAT

SHADE IN STYLE

BESPOKE WINDOW DRESSINGS

STEP 1


HANGING YOUR CURTAINS

Pencil Pleat curtains arrive completely flat and need the pleats to be drawn up. Work from opposite side and draw cords to desired effect.

Pull up to approx half the track/pole length plus 2.5cm for an overlap.

Once gathered tie off the cords. DO NOT CUT THE CORDS.

Use a cord tidy to wrap around excess cord.




STEP 2

INSERTING CURTAIN HOOKS

There are 3 positions for the curtain hooks on the pencil pleat tape.

Position so that the top of the curtain covers the track. This is position B or C (see bellow). If fitting to a pole, the top of the curtain sits below the pole, so the hooks should be placed in position A on the photo opposite.


Fit a hook every 4-5 pockets across the width of the curtain.



STEP 3

DRESSING YOUR CURTAINS

Now it's time to 'teach' the pleats to sit in the correct place.
You'll need to grab your masking tape or just a piece of foil of about 1m in length.
With your curtains stacked against the end of the track, gather them while checking the pleats are still sitting in the correct wave.
Then, loosely tie the tape or foil around the gathered curtains and leave in place for 2-3 days. This will 'teach' the fabric how you want it to sit.



Tip

New curtains sometimes have visible fold lined or they are cressed from the packaging. These will drop once the curtain is hung and the fabric lustre will return. If you have access to iron steamer, you can try lightly steaming the curtains fabric on low setting to encourage those creases to drop out faster.





STEP 1

HANGING YOUR CURTAINS


Pinch Pleat curtains arrive with the 'Microflex' hooks already in position for fitting to a pole. If fitting to a track you will need to readjust the hooks, simply slide the hook to the desired notch to achieve the correct curtain position.






Pole Setting

Track Fitting


Tip

The section of fabric between the pinch pleats need to be pushed back with the pinch pleats themselves standing forwards. Take the centre pleat from each group of pleats and from the top work down the drop of the curtain to form pleats.



STEP 1


HANGING YOUR CURTAINS

Remove the finials, the bits at the end of the rail that keep the curtain from falling off.

Next, thread the eyelets through, folding over the curtain so it hangs nicely.

It might be easier to fold the curtains in one go, before you thread the pole through the eyelets.

Place the end with the first curtain on in the corresponding bracket, and repeat for the other curtain.




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
